Builth Male Voice Choir

Builth has a rich choral tradition going back for well over a hundred years. The present choir began when a group of enthusiasts met at the local Cricket and Rugby Club in the winter of 1968-9, and just over a year after its foundation, "The Builth Wells Cricket and Rugby Club Male Voice Choir" as it was then known, gave its first official concert.

In January 1980 the Choir, by now known more simply as "Builth Male Voice Choir", made its first recording with Swan Records of Swansea and took part in a broadcast in Welsh for BBC Radio. October 1982 saw the Choir performing for the first time at the Albert Hall, an experience that was to be repeated several times over the years and which has seen the Choir televised many times, particularly on S4C.

In recent years the Choir has toured across Europe as well as Wales and the rest of the UK to sing with other choirs and entertaining many thousands of people in venues ranging from tiny churches and village halls to the more impressive surroundings of St David's Hall and the Millennium Centre.
